Associate Professor or Professor, Health Economics, Department of Risk, Insurance and Healthcare Management, Fox School of Business

We are seeking a dynamic and entrepreneurial individual to provide leadership to the Center for Healthcare Research and Management and to teach health economics at the masters and doctoral levels. The candidate is expected to work collaboratively with departmental faculty as well as faculty located in health and health-related schools in seeking research funding and in publishing research. The candidate will also work with faculty and doctoral students in advancing health services, health economic and clinical research in the school and university.

JOB QUALIFICATIONS

A Ph.D. in a related discipline is required, a Ph.D. Economics is preferred. The candidate should have a solid record of scholarship in healthcare economics with publications in the highest quality, top tier journals in the discipline. A record of interdisciplinary funded research in areas of health economics, health services, public health or clinical research is a plus. At a minimum the candidate should qualify for appointment at the Associate Professor level with tenure. Appointment at the level of Professor will be considered for very highly qualified candidates. Compensation is highly competitive. *The candidate must also have a proven record of outstanding teaching as well, and will be expected to teach graduate healthcare economics in our CAHME accredited Healthcare Management Program and College of Health Professions and School of Medicine.*

Joint appointments in the College of Health Professions, College of Liberal Arts or the School of Medicine are possible depending on the candidate's background and interest.

Salary is highly competitive and commensurate with qualifications. The position is available starting September 2010.

Applications should include (a) cover letter, (b) full curriculum vitae, (c) a brief statement of current and future research interests, (d) evidence of excellence in teaching (i.e., evaluations), and (e) the names and contact information for three references.
