The candidate is expected to work collaboratively through the Center for Healthcare Research and Management with departmental and school faculty and faculty from the health and health related schools at Temple University in pursuing funded research.

A Ph.D. in Business, Economics, Public Health or other discipline providing the necessary background in Healthcare Finance and Financial Management is required. The candidate should have a record of scholarship that either is sufficient for appointment at the Associate Professor level or that shows promise warranting appointment at the Assistant level. Exceptional ABD candidates may be considered. The candidate must also show a record of outstanding teaching as well and will be expected to teach undergraduate and graduate healthcare financial management in our CAHME accredited Healthcare Management Program.
