**Client Background:** Founded by Dr. M. Mandy Lin, EverNu Technology LLC is a research and development firm that is currently developing several advanced selective oxidation technologies for the manufacturing of several commodity chemicals using abundantly available natural gas components or lower alkanes as the feedstock. Each of these technologies, when fully developed and commercialized, has the potential leading to multi-trillion Btu of energy saving, along with the reduction of multi-billion pounds of toxic chemical pollutants and cost reduction of hundreds of millions.

EverNu’s SBIR activity started in 2002, when it submitted its first SBIR proposal and received its first grant. EverNu received four more SBIR grants in following years from 2003 to 2005. With these SBIR grants, EverNu has brought about \$1.8 million of federal funding to and has created several job opportunities in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

**Client Problem:** EverNu became a client of the Temple SBDC in 2003. Dr. Lin recognized the need to build a corporate structure to support the management side of her business. The structure would require administrative tools as well as access to new economic opportunities. She also needed assistance identifying and accessing the network of local organizations set up to assist early stage technology companies.

**Temple SBDC Assistance:** SBDC assistance with business structure issues has allowed the client to focus on research and development goals. SBDC consultants performed research for EverNu regarding economic expansion opportunities. The consultant also helped connect client to resources at Innovation Philadelphia and The Benjamin Franklin Technology Partnership. The SBDC is currently researching future SBIR opportunities and access to new government markets.

**Outcome:** Throughout the three year relationship with the SBDC, the client has achieved received five SBIR awards for research and development totaling \$1.8 million (two of them Phase II’s) from the Department of Energy. Phase II projects are progressing and EverNu is seeking partners for future R&D towards commercialization of the technologies developed.
